HEAT Updates:

 HEAT hosted a breakfast meeting with more than a dozen energy executives as part of the American Exploration & Production Council's fly-in. Members and executives discussed the current state of the oil & gas industry and Congress' priorities for energy policy.





• The Republican Study Committee hosted Secretary of the Interior Doug Burgum during its weekly Member lunch. Secretary Burgum briefed Members on the actions that the Department of the Interior and the National Energy Dominance Council are taking to unleash American Energy: <u>Secretary Burgum Champions American Energy Dominance</u> <u>At RSC</u>



 HEAT hosted a "Liquified Natural Gas 101" staff briefing where panelists from the Center for LNG, Cheniere, Venture Global LNG, and Berkshire Hathaway Energy discussed the importance of the United States' LNG export capabilities.

HEAT will host a staff briefing in June focused on artificial intelligence, data centers,
 and growing energy demand. An invite will be circulated to staff.

Member Highlights:

- The House passed H.R. 1, the "One Big Beautiful Bill Act," which includes critical provisions to unleash American energy, including through:
 - Opening federal lands and waters to oil, gas, coal, geothermal, and mineral leasing;
 - o Streamlining permitting processes, including for natural gas exports;
 - Refilling the Strategic Petroleum Reserve;
 - o Reinstating pre-Inflation Reduction Act (IRA) royalty rates; and
 - Repealing wasteful IRA programs and electric vehicle mandates.
- The House passed several Congressional Review Act resolutions to nullify several Biden-era EPA rules, including:

- H.J.Res. 87 (sponsored by Rep. John James), which would repeal the EPA's waiver for California's 'Advanced Clean Trucks' regulations;
- H.J.Res. 88 (sponsored by Rep. John Joyce), which would repeal the EPA's waiver for California's 'Advanced Clean Cars II' EV mandate;
- H.J.Res. 89 (sponsored by Rep. Jay Obernolte), which would repeal the EPA's waiver for California's 'Omnibus NOx' regulations for heavy-duty trucks; and
- S.J.Res. 31, which would repeal the EPA's <u>rule</u> that prohibits "major sources" to reclassify as "area sources" under Sec. 112 of the Clean Air Act, thus disincentivizing industrial, manufacturing, and energy facilities from reducing their emissions. Reps. Julie Fedorchak and Troy Balderson led the House companion to this resolution. Rep. Fedorchak's remarks can be found HERE.
- The House Energy & Commerce Committee held a legislative <u>hearing</u> entitled
 "Assuring Abundant, Reliable American Energy to Power Innovation." The committee
 considered Rep. Balderson's <u>GRID POWER Act</u> and Rep. Pfluger's <u>Unlocking our</u>
 Domestic LNG Potential Act, among other bills.
- The House Energy & Commerce Subcommittee on Oversight and Investigations held a
 hearing entitled "Examining Ways to Enhance our Domestic Critical Mineral Supply
 Chains." Members and witnesses discussed the importance of reforming our outdated
 permitting system and ending our reliance on China to bolster domestic critical
 mineral production and processing.
- President Trump signed into law Rep. Craig Goldman's CRA <u>resolution</u> to overturn the
 Department of Energy's energy conservation standards for commercial refrigeration
 equipment and Rep. Stephanie Bice's CRA <u>resolution</u> to overturn the DOE's energy
 conservation standards for walk-in coolers and freezers: <u>President Trump Gives Biden</u>
 Regulations the Cold Shoulder
- The House Natural Resources Committee held a <u>field hearing</u> in Utah on geothermal energy development on federal lands.
- The House Natural Resources Committee held a <u>hearing</u> entitled: "Unleashing a Golden Age: Examining the Use of Federal Lands to Power American Technological Innovation."
- Rep. Nick Langworthy introduced the <u>State Energy Accountability Act</u> to require states to evaluate the impact of intermittent energy policies on costs and reliability.

- Rep. Jeff Hurd introduced the <u>Productive Public Lands Act</u> to rescind Biden-era Resource Management Plans that restrict energy development on public lands.
- Rep. James Baird introduced the <u>Small Modular Reactor Commercialization Act</u> to support the development and commercialization of small modular reactors.
